

12 Hours of Christmas By Richelle Gilsdorf

On the night of Friday, December 16th, the streets of Albuquerque weren't as quiet—or empty—as you would expect between the hours of ten and seven a.m. From a caravan of five cars came the tinkling of Christmas music and insane laughter, occasionally accompanied by one or two snores. As this mini-parade of vehicles traversed Albuquerque throughout the night, various shopping centers caught strange footage on their parking lot cameras: approximately twenty-five teenagers and adults emerging from these five cars to gather in a circle (or asymmetrical blob, as it were), join hands, and close their eyes. Someone would speak, and then, fast as their shivering, highly-caffeinated, sugar-pumped bodies could move, they'd all dash back to their cars and steal off into the night, the only trace of their presence the three minutes of haunting parking lot footage.

Sounds kind of creepy, right?

Well, what if I told you those kids and adults were members of our church youth group? That the circle and joined hands were the outward signs of love, and that instead of some illegal, late-night cult activity, you were witnessing a city-wide marathon of prayer? And what if I told you that this was the first night of these kids' winter break, that there were probably Christmas parties and get-togethers they skipped to come spend time with Jesus and pray for their schools, pastors, and even complete strangers all night long?

Impressed? Curious? Confused?

Welcome to this year's 12 Hours of Christmas Party with our youth here at Del Norte Baptist. Though this highly-anticipated, annual Christmas party is often full of hours of worship, broomball, games, and more sugary, high-calorie snacks than you can count, this year we decided to change things up, due to both the ongoing construction and our growing emphasis on rekindling prayer in our Christian walk. Acts 1:14 (NIV) mentions how the first disciples were "all joined together constantly in prayer," and the entire book of Acts shows numerous incidents in which the disciples merely gathered in fellowship to pray. It seems only appropriate that we, as modern disciples of Christ, do the same, be it holiday-time or not.

This year, we started the 12 Hours off with Manna, one of our favorite youth activities in which we make peanut butter

and jelly sandwiches and then walk around downtown handing them out to the homeless. This was followed by prayer at UNM, the Baptist Student Union (BSU), Highland High School, Uptown Shopping Center, and the Winrock and Coronado Malls. At each location, we would gather in some semblance of a circle, and one student or adult would pray for the people who come through those areas every day. We prayed that they would come to know the redeeming love of Jesus Christ, and that God would use us to spread this love to them. We drove to the schools of each student in the youth group, and prayed that they would have the courage, strength, and determination to be like "moons" in their schools, reflecting the light of God's love. Throughout the night, we also visited the houses of our pastors and leaders, huddling in the middle of the street for warmth like penguins, and whispering our prayers so as not to wake the neighbors.

We also spent time in our Conference center worshipping, and then later, playing ping-pong at the church. We had an amazing time, growing closer to and making memories with our fellow brothers and sisters in Christ. Whether on the west side, the heights, or downtown, we were joined in prayer for this city within which God has specifically chosen to place us.

To me, one of the most remarkable parts of this experience was the idea that we were awake and actively seeking God while the rest of the city (or the majority of it, anyway) was fast asleep. It was incredible, and such a comfort to think that even while we sleep, God is working in the world—that He never sleeps, and never needs to. It seemed so personal to be with God in the silence of the night, knowing that He was standing there between us in every parking lot, in each car—that He was laughing when we laughed, listening attentively as we prayed, and basking in His own awesome glory as we sang to Him. And all the while He was tweaking each of our hearts, reminding us of why we need Him more than any gift. More importantly, He was convicting us that this world—our city—needs us to do our jobs as Christians, and share His love each and every waking hour, even if that hour comes at 3 a.m. In the end, it's the only thing that matters.

And besides, what better gift could we have hoped to give or get on Christmas?



Elephant Stew

- 1 large elephant
- Brown gravy to taste
- Salt to taste

- Pepper to taste
- 2 rabbits, optional

Cut the elephant in bite-sized pieces, this could take a while. Place in a huge pan and cover with brown gravy. Salt and pepper the stew pieces. Cook over a kerosene fire for about four weeks at 465 degrees. Makes 3800 servings. If more guests are expected, two rabbits may be added. Do so only if necessary, however, as most people do not like to find hare in their stew.

Stuffed Camel

- 1 whole medium-size camel
- 1 whole large-size lamb
- 20 whole medium-size chickens
- 12 kilos rice

- 1 cup palm oil
- 2 kilos pine nuts
- 60 hard boiled eggs, peeled
- 1 kilo pistachio nuts with shells
- 110 gallons of water
- 5 lbs black pepper
- Salt to taste

Preheat large broiler or gas flare. Skin, trim, and clean camel, lamb, chickens and boil until tender. Cook rice until fluffy according to package directions. In a large skillet, heat palm oil, add nuts, and sauté until browned. In a huge bowl, mix ³/₄ of the pine nuts with rice, reserving the rest to be used for garnish. Stuff the chickens with ³/₄ of the eggs and the rice mixture. The remaining eggs will be used for garnish. Stuff the lamb with five of the chickens and some rice. Stuff the camel with the lamb and some more rice. Broil in a large over or near the gas flare until brown. Spread the remaining rice on a very large tray and place the camel on top. Place the rest of the chickens around the camel. Garnish the rice with boiled eggs, almonds and pistachios. Season with salt and pepper. This recipe serves a friendly crowd of 80 to 100.
