WHY DO WE GO TO CHURCH

Why do we gather together as believers? Why not just try to be the best Christian I can be, on my own, all private like?

A quick internet search finds two excellent quotes from theologian David Mathis: “worshiping Jesus together may be the single most important thing we do” and “corporate worship brings together God's Word, prayer, and fellowship, and so makes for the greatest means of God's ongoing grace in the Christian life.”

Let's go a little deeper. God created humankind so we could “commune” with Him. Still today, God desires a relationship with each of His children; whom He created in His image. He wishes for each of us to choose Him and His ways. Once we have a personal relationship with God we are encouraged by Him to join with other believers so that we can fellowship with each other and experience Him “together.” Just like so many other activities, we often do worship more effectively when we do it together.

God's desire is for you and me to worship Him every day, moment by moment. I don't know about you, but I need help. Here are just a few examples of how I can find help in developing my relationship with God as I commune with God among His people.

- I desperately need encouragement from, and fellowship with, fellow believers.
- Because I am weak, I need accountability. I need others with whom I can walk the “journey,” who will help me keep from stumbling, and when I do stumble they can help me up. Likewise, they need me to help them.

Acts 2:42 (NIV) *They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.*

Ephesians 5:19b–21 (PHILLIPS NT) *Express your joy in singing among yourselves psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, making music in your hearts for the ears of God! Thank God at all times for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. And “fit in with” each other, because of your common reverence for Christ.*

1 Timothy 4:13 (NLT) *...focus on reading the Scriptures to the church, encouraging the believers, and teaching them.*

Psalms 95:1–11 (ESV) *Oh come, let us sing to the Lord; let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation! Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to him with songs of praise! For the Lord is a great God, and a great King above all gods. In his hand are the depths of the earth; the heights of the mountains are his also. The sea is his, for he made it, and his hands formed the dry land. ...*

Colossians 3:16b–17 (PHILLIPS NT) *Teach and help one another along the right road with your psalms and hymns and Christian songs, singing God's praises with joyful hearts. And whatever you may have to do, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, thanking God the Father through him.*

This year's melodrama had its Final Curtain on Saturday, February 16th. Allow me to re-cap the successes of the show:

- We had 5 Show Dates, which includes 533 paying customers.
- Ticket Sales plus donations made our gross income near \$9,800.
- After the expenses for food, props, costumes, and supplies it is possible that we will clear somewhere between \$5,500 - \$6,000.
- We were blessed with 5 wonderful audiences who were generous in sharing their applause and laughter. There were 55 different people involved in cooking the meals and washing the dishes.
- There was a total of 11 cast members, 1 prompter, 3 technical crew members, several security patrol people each night on the parking lots plus all the youth & adults who served meals each night.
- That adds up to over 100 people.

It is NO exaggeration to say, we could not do the show without all these folks.

CHALLENGES:

Over half the cast members were sick at one time or another during the two weeks of the event, which resulted in our canceling of the Free Show we do every year. It was a great disappointment for us as well as those who always support that event.

BLESSINGS:

The new Cowboy Church starting up in the Edgewood area will receive half the proceeds from the show. The other half will go to our Mission Fund.

The Knit One, Pray Too ministry has been a part of Del Norte Baptist Church for several years. Gaby Payne, the founder of the ministry, was concerned that knitting was a dying art. She wanted to share her love of the hobby, but also make it a ministry. She began thinking about the common knitting stitch, “Knit one, Pearl Two”, combined with the idea of a prayer ministry and came up with the name, “Knit One, Pray Too”. She decided that every time they met they would review the Wednesday night prayer list and discuss who else they need to pray for and why. However, she was, and continues to be, cautious not to let this turn into a gossip session.

This ministry does not only reach out through prayer, though. They also knit hats, mittens, and scarves for the homeless, Salvation Army bell ringers, and the New Mexico Baptist Children’s Home. Additionally, they have made patchwork quilts for the police to give to people in need as they see fit. They donated hats and scarves for the church to take with them when we did our Alaska mission trips as well. Of course, as they work on these projects they pray for the recipients.

While they are very mission minded, they also encourage people to bring their own projects to work on. Even if you don’t have a project of your own, or are just wanting to learn to knit, Gaby stresses that all levels are welcome. She comes prepared to teach people how to knit each meeting. While she brings extra yarn and needles to all the meetings, if you want to bring your own, Gaby recommends size 7 or 8 straight needles and worsted weight #4 yarn.

Gaby does recognize that it has been a struggle to keep a core group of people involved in the ministry. As people move or get busy, the attendees have fluctuated. However, the highlights far outweigh the struggles. They have so much fun and really enjoy their time knitting and praying together. Additionally, Gaby says a personal highlight for her has been teaching people how to knit and watching them complete their first projects. Related to this, she hopes that, in the future, the ministry can continue to teach people how to knit and that they will pass the hobby on to others.

If you would like to be a part of this ministry, they meet the first and fourth Tuesdays of every month at the church in room 120.



One thing is for sure, you will never meet another individual quite like Pastor Brad Kelly! You might need a Southern to English translator to understand what he is saying, but once you figure that out there is absolutely no denying his passion for God and His people. TERM OF THE ISSUE

Substitutionary Atonement

Refers to the doctrine that Christ died on the cross as a substitute for sinners. God imputed the guilt of our sins to Christ, and he, in our place, bore the punishment that we deserve. This was a full payment for sins, which satisfied both the wrath and the righteousness of God, so that He could forgive sinners without compromising His own holy standard.

The Penal-Substitution Theory of the atonement was formulated by the 16th century Reformers as an extension of Anselm's Satisfaction theory. Anselm's theory was correct in introducing the satisfaction aspect of Christ's work and its necessity; however the Reformers saw it as insufficient because it was referenced to God's honor rather than his justice and holiness and was couched more in terms of a commercial transaction than a penal substitution. This Reformed view says simply that Christ died for man, in man's place, taking his sins and bearing them for him. The bearing of man's sins takes the punishment for them and sets the believer free from the penal demands of the law: The righteousness of the law and the holiness of God are satisfied by this substitution.

"For our sake He made Him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God." - 2 Corinthians 5:21
